

	Notes	Average cost of gun-shot victims treated and released the same day = \$1,428 (ER base cost) Average cost of gun-shot victims requiring surgery and hospital stay = \$87,097 (surgery cost) + \$56,092 (hospital stay & rehabilitation center) Average cost of gun-shot victims who required surgery, a hospital stay, and were released to rehabilitation centers = \$144,617(ER cost, surgery & rehabilitation cost) Formula for this study: (Base cost + surgery cost - 1/5 (20%) of surgery cost) = \$70,820 per shooting victim requiring surgery and rehabilitation.

An average of 20 hours is spent on attempted murder cases and 400 hours for homicides cases. \$31/hr (2 Detectives) x 10 hours = \$620 \$31/hr (2 Detectives) x 200 hours = \$12,400 	1087 hours to defend & prosecute a murder case x \$85 (DA \$47/hr + PD \$38/ hr) = \$92,395 + 40% overhead = \$129,353. To defend an attempted-murder case requires 1/7 of the time = \$13,175	Combined hourly rates + Overhead of the following staff: Judge, Bailiff, Court Reporter, Clerk = \$155 per hour. \$155 x 44 hours (murder case) = \$6,820 \$155 x 6 hours (A felony) = \$930

Since victim may be a major financial contributor to the household, many families may need to apply for social services support. The estimate for this study is for 1 year of Social Service assistance. ($$961/$ mo x 12 months) x 2 people = $$23,064$	Cost per autopsy = FY20 General Fund budget of \$13,798,000 and 1,974 full autopsies. Cost /autopsy = \$6,989.

But if person has to serve a 15 year sentence, then (\$693 x 15 years) = \$10,395 of missed revenue. If shooting victim doesn't work for one year, then an additional \$630 of loss revenue is added.	State income tax= 0%. Combined sales taxes = 7% (State 6%, County 1%). If person earns 30k/year and 1/3 of income toward purchases = $\$9,900$ per year ($\$693/yr$). But if person has to serve a 30 years sentence and the other dead, then ($\$693 \times 30$ years x 2 people), for a combined loss revenue of $\$37,283$.
