

	Notes	Average cost of gun-shot victims treated and release the same day = \$1,428 (ER base Cost) Average cost of gun-shot victims requiring surgery and hospital stay = \$87,097 (Surgery Cost) + \$56,092 (Hospital stay & Rehab costs) Average cost of gun-shot victims who required surgery, a hospital stay, and were released to rehabilitation centers = \$144,617 Formula for this study: (ER base cost + Surgery Cost - 1/5 (20%) of surgery cost) = \$70,820 per shooting victim requiring surgery.

An average of 125 hours is spent on attempted murder cases and 200 hours for homicides cases. \$23/hr (Detective) x 125 hours = \$2,875 \$23/hr (Detective) x 200 hours = \$4,600 	1087 hours to defend & prosecute a murder case x \$36 (hourly rates) x 2 people (DA & PD) = \$78,264 +10% overhead = \$86,090. Attempted murder cases serve an average of 20 years in State Prison, subtracting pretrial 'time-served' in County Jail. (\$72/day x 18 years) = \$473,040 	<pre>\$72/day to Incarcerate Adult in State Prison. Average inmate serves 25 years for murder, minus time served. (\$72/day x 23 years = \$604,440)</pre>

Since victim may be a major financial contributor to the household, many families may need to apply for social services support. The estimate for this study is for 1 year of Social Service assistance. (\$873 / mo x 12 months) x 2 people = \$20,952	National average for autopsies performed by the county corners office is \$2,500.

	Notes	State income tax= 4%. Combined sales taxes = 10.5% (State 4%, County 1.5%, City 5%). If person earns 30k/year and 1/3 of income toward purchases = \$9,900 per year (\$1,039/yr Sales Tax)(\$1,463 Income Tax Link). But if person has to serve a <i>20 years</i> sentence, then (\$1,039 × 20 years) = \$20,780 sales tax revenue. (\$1,463 × 20 years) = \$29,260 income tax revenue. (\$1,463 × 20 years) = \$29,260 income tax revenue. If shooting victim doesn't work for one year, then an additional \$2,502 (\$1,039 + \$1,463) of loss revenue is added.
